Ordinance Status

John lacoangeli provided a Zoning Audit for each Township and audit of the common themes. Templates for Blight and Riparian ordinances are online at the L2L website. Rural Preservation was a common theme that needs to be defined. Three of the 7 areas also mentioned home occupation/cottage industry. The goal is not to standardize the ordinances but rather to standardize the process, procedure and administration of such things as site plan reviews, zoning administration/enforcement, riparian management, blight, etc.

Next Steps: Invite one person from each Planning Commission to work on Zoning Template with John Iacoangeli. Denise recommended inviting the ZA to be a part of the process. Monica is organizing and will send out an email with details.

Leadership Team Facilitation/Education Update

Tim and Monica have been working on Leadership team capacity-building through training and certifications. Monica provided a list of potential educational topics centered around the priorities that the L2L community has set. She suggested the idea of contracting a qualified Facilitator to help the various teams move forward and look steps ahead.

Trail Leadership Team Update

Bruce Ogilvie reported that he is having a difficult time convening a Trails leadership team. He thought that Roger Griner might be better able to do it. Chris Sullivan, Barbara Nelson-Jamison, Bill Herd and others were also recommended to Monica, who will try to get the ball rolling.

Next steps: get input from stakeholders who indicated they wanted to be involved. Tim Ervin will be meeting with Mike DiBarnardo and Jody Gruner from MDARD on Monday to talk about funding priorities.

Wrap Up


There will be no meeting in October. The Celebration, Award Banquet on Mackinac Island and Place-making Training will all take place in October. .
