April 11, 2012 1:00 p.m. Pleasant Valley Community Center

Introduction of Leadership Team Members

Introduction of Todd Kalish, MDNR Lake Erie Basin Coordinator- Place-Making

Tim Ervin remphasized AES' goal to make sure that the plan is implemented and to connect the plan with the financial resources necessary to make things happen. He gave examples of how AES helped the City of Manistee and Village of Onekama secure \$800,000 in grants.

Todd Kalish, DNR Fisheries Division

Todd Kalish has been following this project from the sidelines along with others in local, state and federal agencies. He called the project "creative, unique, innovative and inspiring" and believes that it setting the bar for effective collaboration among numerous stakeholders for a common goal. This is being watched and admired. He enumerated the DNR's four priorities, including the priority he leads, which is to actively partner with groups and commit significant resources to several Place-Making Initiatives. What L2LRI is doing is at the foundation of Place-making because it maintains the individuality of each township while working together for the larger good. Besides finding how they can fit, they want feedback on how they can be more effective with the resources and expertise it can contribute. The discussion included examples of opportunities to link goals and where collaboration in the past was and was not beneficial; mobile boat wash; Asian Carp efforts, addressing delays in permitting, and the DNR's potential role in working with other agencies to establish M-22 as a scenic corridor. Tim Ervin expressed his view that the appeal to the DNR and others looking for efficient ways to use their resources is that there isn't another effort like this. It provides a critical mass to work with unlike any other in Michigan. From AES' standpoint of helping communities convert plans to tangible results, it is their hope that other agencies will follow suit and see this as a good investment. The DNR has a 10-member team in place and can devote personnel. There were no objections to extending a welcome to the DNR to sit in on the visioning sessions and as a result help identify assets that can be plugged into an implementation strategy.

Talking points and answers to basic questions were reviewed and discussed. Additional suggestions included decreasing the emphasis on regulations as a means to achieve the ends; addressing the role of external communities; diffrentiation from the Grand Vision; including The Conference of Communities as a process step with dates TBD; including phone numbers and email addresses of core contacts for each community; including the recreation plan; and answering the question: What is the L2LRI?

Status of outreach efforts to potential project partners: On April 10, 2012 at their regular Planning Commission Meeting, The City of Frankfort Planning Commission voted unanimously to collaborate with The Lakes to Land Regional Initiative. Two representatives, Bruce Ogilvie and Jim Campbell were present and updated the group about the collaborative and consensus-building process they used to update their Master Plan and Zoning Ordinance. Those documents are available on the city's website. Frankfort was welcomed to the process and advised that their participation will come during Conference of Communities.
