Purposes

- * Support and respect individuality and uniqueness of each Township while creating economies of scale to address common issues and concerns.
- * Establish visions/blueprints for each township and collaborative visions/action plans
- * Identify opportunities for intergovernmental cooperation/service sharing
- * Identify assets that can be leveraged among several entities
- * Establish corridors for things like agriculture, tourism, non-motorized transportation, etc.
- * Shared solutions/approaches for common issues
- * Develop basis for updating ordinances
- * Create critical mass/economy of scale to compete for resources

Leadership Team

- * Two reps – each participating township
- * Oversee RFP for consultant services
- * Select consultant: unanimous selection of BR
- * Provide general guidance to ensure project is successfully completed

- * Involve planning commission and township boards
