

Food Systems Profile Benzie County, Michigan

The production, distribution, consumption, and disposal of food are critical parts of our economy, community well-being, and family health in the Midwest. This profile provides an overview of existing data across a broad scope of food systems activities. It also documents how key indicators are changing over time and serves as a baseline for community leaders and educators to identify opportunities for growth in regional food systems. Data for this profile was compiled from existing secondary data sources including the U.S. Census of Agriculture and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Regional averages include Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.
